SPEECH & DRAMA SPECIAL AWARDS

- Sir Robert Hobart Rose Bowl awarded for the Highest Mark gained in the Speech and Drama Sections;
- The Charles Blake Memorial Cup awarded for the Highest Marks in Classes 465, 466 & 467;
- The Hon Mrs Mitcheson Cup (Lady Seely Junior Cup) for the Highest Individual Mark in Junior Piano, Strings, Woodwind & Drama Sections;
- Lady Seely Senior Cup for the Highest Individual Mark in the Senior Strings, Piano, Woodwind and Drama Sections:
- The Thomas Hudson Shield for the Highest Aggregate Score in Literary Composition;
- Joan Timms (nee Pleninger) Salver for the Highest Mark in the Miming Teams.
- Joy Hall Trophy given at the Adjudicator's sole discretion in recognition of a memorable and worthy performance in the Drama section.

THE FOLLOWING RULES APPLY TO BOTH THE SENIOR & JUNIOR SECTIONS

(To be read in conjunction with the Main Festival Rules)

- 1. The IWMDDF has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society (ALCS). This means that entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items performed to a time
- Solo dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.
- Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.
- Team is defined as between 4 and 15 persons in total, unless otherwise stated; e.g. any number allowed in Classes 439, 440, 441, 442, 443 and 495 but Health & Safety considerations must prevail.
- No competitor may compete more than once in any SOLO Class.
- Time Limits must be strictly adhered to or the performance will be stopped.
- Anything of an adult or explicit nature should be brought to the attention of a member of the Speech & Drama Committee as soon as is practicable or, failing that, to the Table Steward or Adjudicator on the day, prior to performance. The Committee reserves the right to stop a performance if deemed offensive.
- Curtained background where provided will be used for all Classes.
- Essential hand props are permitted in all Classes except Miming, where they are prohibited.
- 10. In the Miming Classes, a short sub-title may be given.
- 11. In the Miming Classes, background music may be used as a stimulus.
- 12. Costume is not allowed in the Miming Classes.
- 13. Costume is optional in Drama and Duologue Classes.
- 14. Plays: the Title, Type and Period of the play (e.g. Comedy, Drama etc. and Modern, Restoration etc.) along with the performance time must be stated on the Entry Form.
- 15. In the Drama and Senior Duologue Classes, a limit of 5 minutes is allowed for setting the stage after it has been cleared by the previous team.

Please note that entries can only be accepted on official entry forms.

JUNIOR SECTION

- In all Solo speaking, competitors will be judged on the test pieces only. No own choice pieces will be required.
- The Junior section is open to all competitors aged 18 and under on September 1st 2020.
- For all Junior Solo Classes, the Entrance Fee is £6.00, unless otherwise stated.
- The Closing Date for all Entries is: 8th December 2020
